Authors of the 12th International Young Scientists Conference are invited to submit full manuscripts for publication in the Conference Proceedings. Manuscripts will undergo peer review process and consequent revision by authors when required.

Deadline for submission of full manuscripts: December 19, 2016.

Structure of the article

- *Author's name, surname* (12 pt, Bold, All Caps).
- *Name of the institution* (12 pt, Normal), country (12 pt Normal).
- *Title of the article* (14 pt Bold, All Caps).
- *Summary of 1500 characters* (12 pt, Italic)*.
- *Key words* (3–5)
- *Body of the article* (12 pt, Normal).
- *References (List of sources)* (10 pt, Normal).

*** Structure of the body of the article:**

- *Introduction* (12 pt, Normal) – author briefly describes the topicality of the study, specifies the scope of problems which the author focuses on in this study.
- *The Aim of the Study* (12 pt, Normal).
- *Methods* (12 pt, Normal) – the author provides the theoretical grounds of the problem, points out the existing contradictions and problems in studies carried out by other authors, describes how the study was organised, gives information about respondents, methods used, data processing.
- *Results* (12 pt, Normal) – the author introduces readers with the data gained during the study carried out. The author has to select data for analyses according to the aim of the study.
- *Discussion and Conclusions* (12 pt, Normal) – The discussion and conclusion section should interpret in-depth the results from the study. The significant results should be discussed in light in the research field with the references, and can be used to justify the hypothesis. The researcher may agree or disagree with the previous studies. A clear, realistic conclusions based on proposed hypothesis should be made. Conclusions can include the possible applications of the future research.

At the end of the article the following should be mentioned: author's name, surname, scientific degree, position, institution, study year, study program, level of the study program (e.g. bachelor, master, doctoral), personal address, telephone number, e-mail address (10 pt, Normal).

Requirements for the organization of the article: The article should be 5 to 8 pages including references and summary of 1500 characters. The article should be typewritten in A4 format, set in one column according to the following parameters: margins – 2.5 cm, text editor – *Word, Times New Roman*, font number 12, spaces between lines – 1. Each paragraph should start with a 1.5 cm indentation. Pages and tables, pictures should be numbered. Tables should be black and white, cited in the text; Arabic numbering should be used. The size of tables should not exceed A4 format page.

References should be indicated in the typescript by giving the author's name, with the year of publication in parentheses – (Bamberger, 1991) or (Leiter & Maslach, 1998)

The references should be listed in full at the end of the paper in the order of Latin alphabet, followed by literature in Cyrillic alphabet. References should follow the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (APA 6th edition, 2009).

Criteria for evaluation (in 5 point system)

- Originality and topicality of the theme / problem.
- Scientific / practical value of results / conclusions.
- Logic of the content.
- Language of the article.
- References are indicated correctly (Quotation in the text and sources indicated in References chalk out).
- Manuscript is constructed according to the requirements.

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
