

PAPER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- 1. Papers must be original and not submitted to any other scientific journal.
- 2. Papers are written in English.
- 3. Papers should be prepared according to APA (6th ed.), except for the title page (see a template below).
- 4. A paper should consist of no more than 3,000 words, including all references.
- 5. Submitted papers should include:
 - an abstract (no more than 100 words);
 - 3-5 key words;
 - an introduction and a body with:
 - description of a Decoding bottleneck;
 - description of the course and classroom context within which a chosen bottleneck was decoded;
 - reflections on the Decoding method and other relevant pedagogical theories;
 - the conclusions part, with reflections on the usefulness of the Decoding method and ways of applying it in your future courses;
 - the reference list.
- 6. All references should appear as footnotes.

7. The Author should include his or her name, surname, email address, and institutional affiliation.

8. Papers should use 12 pt Times New Roman, 1.5 line-spacing.

Introduction. 12 pt., Times New Roman, justified alignment, first line identified by 1,27 cm. 2 pt. Spacing

Theoretical background. 12 pt., Times New Roman, justified alignment, first line identified by 1,27 cm.

Illustrations and tables, 10 pt., Times New Roman.

Illustrations should be clear and easy to read. Make sure, that all figures mentioned in the text, are provided in the manuscript. For the numeration, please use the abbreviation "Fig.", e.g. Fig. 1, etc. It is important to ensure the sequential numeration of figures. Do not put borders around the outside of figures.

Charts, figures and tables must contain only essential data. No abbreviation is needed when presenting the table, e.g. Table 1, etc.
